## What is a BioBlitz?

A BioBlitz is a focused event where people work together to record as many plants and animals as possible in a set area and time. No experience needed — curiosity encouraged!

## Programme Breakdown

**12:00 – 12.30 pm | Getting Started (Church Lane Carpark - see details above)**

- Demo of what to expect during the BioBlitz
- How to use iNaturalist and/or paper spotter sheets
- Tips for observing and recording wildlife

**12:30 – 1:30 pm | Guided “Chalk and Walk” (Walking our corridor together)**

- Join a guided walk along the corridor
- Help identify urban wildflowers sprouting along paths and edges
- Chalk markings used to highlight plants as we go



**1:30 – 2:00 pm | Your Own 1 m<sup>2</sup> Nature Patch (Horsforth Rec, Low Lane)**

- Choose a small 1 m<sup>2</sup> area
- Identify all the species you can find in your patch
- Work individually or in small groups — slow down and look closely



**2:00 – 3:00 pm | Riverfly Monitoring (Horsforth Rec, Low Lane)**

- Sam Riley-Gunn from the Aire River Trust will demonstrate how we monitor what's going on beneath the surface of the water.
- The Riverfly Partnership are working to protect the water quality of watercourses, and conserving and furthering the understanding of riverfly populations
